


## Case for Support: Embracing Brokenness Ministries in Prison

Our Ministry: As a teaching, training, equipping and discipling ministry, EBM assists those wanting to go deeper into their transformational journey with Christ; willing to be authentic and vulnerable in their own experience of brokenness in the process. By presenting and studying God's Word, our ministry is designed to help explore areas where false beliefs about God – which often lead to false views of self and others – hinder spiritual formation. In addressing personal and spiritual brokenness we can live a more fulfilled and intimate relationship with Christ. From the place of wholeness our Kingdom impact is more genuine and effective. A significant part of our ministry is directed toward the marginalized in our society.

In the Prison: One of our core initiatives involves the development and delivery of a thoughtfully crafted teaching series. This series, regularly presented at Lancaster County Prison, serves as a beacon of hope and guidance. Through engaging sessions, we address various aspects of personal development, spirituality, and resilience in this series we call Identity Matters. Recognizing the unique needs of each individual, we take seriously our one-on-one interactions with inmates. Whether it's a listening ear, guidance on personal challenges, or spiritual support, we meet with inmates outside the classroom on a regular basis.

The Challenge: Studies suggest that access to education and spiritual resources can contribute to reducing recidivism rates. By providing Christian content on tablets, we contribute to the rehabilitation of inmates, offering them tools for personal growth and transformation that may positively impact their behavior both during incarceration and upon reentry into society. In an era marked by technological advancements, Embracing Brokenness Ministries is proud to announce a strategic partnership with God Behind Bars and the Pando App. This collaboration represents a groundbreaking initiative to bring Christian content and hope to the incarcerated population in the United States.

The focus is on leveraging technology as a tool for transformation, offering incarcerated individuals a chance to encounter the truths evidenced in God's Word.

**Power of Transformation:** This partnership is not just about numbers; it's about the tangible impact on lives behind bars. By offering teaching series, podcasts, devotionals, and more, we aim to instill hope and resilience in an environment often characterized by despair. The Pando App becomes a beacon of light, contributing to the positive transformation of those within the prison system.

Annual EBM Prison Ministry Budget: As a provider, EBM directly sponsors 1,000 future tablets at roughly \$18 per tablet per year. This comes out to \$1,500/month, or \$18,000/year, for the Basic Provider Tier. This allows us to upload 6-8 videos per month to the PandoApp nationwide, while also helping expand Pando's reach to more inmates! Video production is estimated at \$50-75,000 annually, depending on content creation, production values, and gift in kind opportunities. Prison Ministry Staff budget allocation estimated at \$30,000 annually.
